Diene Keita UNFPA Deputy Executive Director, Programme The joint statement by 24 Member States commended the Evaluation Office on its **continued flexibility to adapt evaluation to the COVID-19 context** and to enable evaluations as an accelerator to recovery from the COVID-19 crisis. The Member States also commended the latest evaluation frameworks that are key to make the evaluation function fit to support the delivery of UNFPA strategic plan 2022-2025. This includes the (1) <u>quadrennial budgeted evaluation plan;</u> (2) <u>evaluation strategy</u> and the (3) <u>strategy to enhance evaluation use through communications and knowledge management</u>.

The Member States noted the excellent performance of the evaluation function again in a highly challenging year, including the strengthening of the decentralized evaluation system that has resulted in a high implementation rate of good quality evaluations. The strong push for involving youth in evaluations including as evaluators was also appreciated by the Member States. They welcomed the commitment and active support of the UNFPA Evaluation Office to the reform agenda and encouraged UNFPA to continue to increase investments in the evaluation function.

I'm very pleased to share the <u>2021 Annual Report on the evaluation function</u>. The report captures the performance of the UNFPA evaluation function, its ongoing **adaptation to COVID-19**, contribution to **coherence in evaluation** across the UN system and support to **national evaluation capacities development**.

The report captures the efforts to further make the evaluation function fit to **accelerate the delivery of the UNFPA strategic plan 2022-2025**, through the development of three new <u>evaluation frameworks</u>.

With **real-time adaptation** and enhanced systems, capacities and tools at centralized and decentralized levels, the Evaluation Office enhanced its **agility and responsiveness to the COVID-19 crisis**. These efforts ensured strong performance of the evaluation function, with eight out of nine KPIs achieved or almost achieved despite continuing challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic. A few highlights are as follows:

- For the third year in a row, all evaluations were quality-assessed as 'good' or higher
- **95%** of management responses on UNFPA evaluations were implemented. This is the highest in ten years!
- **96.5%** of country offices have conducted at least one country programme evaluation within two cycles
- **23** centralized and decentralized programme level evaluations were completed in 2021, compared to 10 in 2018
- 100% of centralized evaluations scheduled have been completed or are on track

In 2021, **57% of centralized evaluations were either joint or system-wide**, demonstrating Evaluation Office's commitment to the United Nations development system reform. The Evaluation Office also expanded national evaluation capacities with **youth** firmly at the center of these efforts. Notably, the <u>Eval4Action</u> <u>campaign</u>, co-led by the Evaluation Office, EvalYouth and the Global Parliamentarians Forum for Evaluation, rallied more than **150 partners** globally in less than two years.

As UNFPA moves towards the implementation of the UNFPA strategic plan 2022-2025, we hope to build on these achievements to further strengthen evaluation, in order to support the strong corporate commitment to adaptation, evidence-based learning and decision making.
