In alignment with this vision, we are pleased to release a new guidance on integrating the principles of leaving no one behind and reaching the furthest behind in UNFPA evaluations. Using a human rights-based approach and an intersectional lens, the guidance provides a clear and systematic pathway for evaluations to address the root causes of discrimination, stereotypes, social norms, stigma, xenophobia, racism, inequity, and gender inequality.

In particular, the guidance includes examples to:

- 1. Mainstream the principles of leaving no one behind and reaching the furthest behind in evaluation process and practice; and
- 2. Develop targeted evaluation questions that address these dimensions

Complementing this guidance, a new resource on integrating social and environmental standards into evaluations will be available shortly. I'm confident this timely guidance will further enrich evaluation evidence at UNFPA, contributing to increased adaptation, acceleration and accountability - a prerequisite to create a resilient future for all.
